NEW SYSTEM FEATURES

REARVIEW MONITOR (if so equipped)

- When the shift lever is shifted into the R (REVERSE) position, the monitor display shows a rearward view from the vehicle.
- The colored guide lines on the display screen indicate vehicle width and approximate distances to objects with reference to the vehicle body line:
 - Red 1.5 ft (0.5 m); Yellow 3 ft (1 m); Green 7 ft (2 m) and 10 ft (3 m).

NAVTRAFFIC* AND NAVWEATHER* (if so equipped)

- Your vehicle's Navigation System is equipped with NavTraffic and NavWeather capabilities.
- NavTraffic enables your vehicle's Navigation System to display real-time traffic conditions, such as accidents or road construction, and may provide a detour to help avoid congestion.
- NavWeather tracks nationwide weather information, provides real-time weather reports and automatically alerts you to severe weather conditions around your current vehicle location.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS)

- A CHECK TIRE PRESSURE warning message will appear in the vehicle information display
 and the low tire pressure warning light
 will illuminate when one or more tires are low in pressure and air is needed.
 - The tire pressures should be checked when the tires are cold. The tires are considered cold after the vehicle has been parked for 3 hours or more or driven less than 1 mi (1.6 km) at moderate speeds.



- After tire pressures are adjusted, drive the vehicle at speeds above 16 mph (25 km/h). The CHECK TIRE PRESSURE warning message and the low tire pressure warning light will extinguish.
- Tire pressure rises and falls depending on the heat caused by the vehicle's operation and the outside temperature. Low outside temperature can lower the temperature of the air inside the tire, which can cause a lower tire inflation pressure. This may cause the low tire pressure warning light to illuminate. If the warning light illuminates, check the tire pressure in your tires.
 - Check the tire pressure (including the spare tire) often and always prior to long distance trips.
- When the low tire pressure warning light flashes for 1 minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. Have the system checked by a NISSAN dealer.
- The Tire and Loading Information label contains valuable information. Please refer to the "Technical and consumer information (section 9)" of your Owner's Manual for the location of the Tire and Loading Information label.

LOOSE FUEL CAP

- A LOOSE FUEL CAP warning message will appear in the vehicle information display
 when the fuel-filler cap is not tightened correctly.
- To tighten, turn the cap clockwise until a single click is heard.
- The warning message will extinguish when the vehicle detects the fuel-filler cap is properly tightened and the reset button
 2 is pressed.
- If the cap is not properly tightened, the Malfunction Indicator Light [] may illuminate.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

FUEL-FILLER DOOR

- The fuel-filler door is located on the driver's side of the vehicle.
- To open the fuel-filler door, pull the lid open.

CLOCK SET/ADJUSTMENT (Type A) (if so equipped)

- To adjust the time and the appearance of the clock on the display:
 - 1. Press the **SETTING** button on the control panel.

- The following settings can be adjusted:
 - On-screen Clock: The clock in the upper right corner of the display can be turned
 ON or OFF.
 - Clock Format (24h): The clock can be set to 12 hours or 24 hours.
 - Offset (hour): The time can be adjusted by increasing or decreasing per hour.
 - Offset (min): The time can be adjusted by increasing or decreasing per minute.
 - Daylight Savings Time: The application of Daylight Savings Time can be turned
 ON or OFF.
 - Time Zone: Adjust the time zone. Choose a time zone from the available list.
- Press the BACK button to return to the previous screen.



FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

NISSAN INTELLIGENT KEY® SYSTEM (if so equipped)

The NISSAN Intelligent Key® System allows you to lock or unlock the vehicle, open the liftgate and start the engine. It is important to make sure the Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).



- To lock the vehicle, push either door handle request switch 1 once or press the button 2 on the key fob.
- To unlock the vehicle, perform one of the following procedures:
 - Push either door handle request switch 1 once; the corresponding door will unlock. Push the door handle request switch 1 again within 30 seconds; all other doors will unlock, or
 - Press the button on the key fob to unlock the driver's side door. Press the button again; all other doors will unlock.
- To open the liftgate, press the HOLD button 4 for more than 1 second.
- The Intelligent Key can also be used to activate the panic alarm by pressing and holding the putton for more than 0.5 seconds. Once activated, the panic alarm and headlights will stay on for a period of time.

POWER LIFTGATE RELEASE (if so equipped)

When the liftgate is closed, the liftgate will fully open automatically by:

- Pushing the power liftgate switch 1 on the instrument panel.
- Pulling the power liftgate handle 2 once the vehicle is unlocked.





Pressing the rear liftgate release button 3 on the key fob for more than 1 second.

POWER FRONT SEAT ADJUSTMENTS

- To slide the seat forward or backward, push the switch 1 forward or backward.
- To adjust the angle of the seatback, push the switchforward or backward.



To adjust the angle and height of the seat cushion, push the front or rear end of the switch 1 up or down.

POWER LUMBAR SUPPORT (driver's seat)

■ To adjust the lumbar area, push the front or back end of the switch 3.

TIP UP FOR EASY ENTRY/EXIT OF THE 3RD ROW

- Raise the armrest (captain's chairs) so it is parallel to the seatback and in the stowed position.
- Then lift up on the seatback latch 2 located on the upper corner of the seatback and fold the seatback forward onto the seat base.







3. Finally, lift up on the lower corner of the seat base and fold the seat forward.



3RD ROW POWER FOLDING SEATS (if so equipped)

- Before operating the 3RD row seats:
 - Make sure the 2ND row seatback is not reclined.
 - Lower the 3RD row headrest to the full down position.
 - Disconnect and secure the center seat belt and tongue into the retractor base. Always reconnect the center seat belt when the seat is returned to the upright position.
 - Make sure that there are no objects on the seatback cushion.
- The 3RD row power folding seat controls are located behind the 2ND row seat (passenger's side) on the 3RD row cup holder console 1 and on the rear quarter trim panel behind the 3RD row
- seats (passenger's side) 2.
 To fold down the 3RD row seats, push and hold the bottom portion of the switch.
- To raise the 3RD row seats, push and hold the top portion of the switch.
- If the ignition switch is in the OFF position, the power folding seats are always operational.
- If the ignition switch is in the ON position, the power folding seats are only operational when the shift lever is in the P (PARK) or N (NEUTRAL) position.

AUTOMATIC DRIVE POSITIONER (if so equipped)

- Two positions for the driver's seat, accelerator and brake pedals and outside mirrors can be stored in the automatic drive positioner memory.
- Follow this procedure to set the memory positions:
 - Confirm the shift lever is in the P (PARK) position.
 - Place the ignition switch in the ON position.
 - Adjust the driver's seat, accelerator and brake pedals and outside mirrors to the desired positions using the adjusting switches for each feature.
 - Push the **SET** switch, and within 5 seconds, push the memory switch (1 or 2) for at least 1 second.
 - The indicator light on the memory switch you select will illuminate for approximately 5 seconds.
 - The driver's seat, accelerator and brake pedals and outside mirror positions are now set to your preferences.
- These memorized positions can also be linked to your NISSAN Intelligent Key®.
- To link a memorized position to your NISSAN Intelligent Key®, press the unlock button on the key fob after completing the previous step.



OUTSIDE MIRROR CONTROL SWITCH

- To select the right or left side mirror, turn the control switch 11 right or left.
- To adjust the mirror angle, move the control switchup, down, right or left.
- To prevent accidentally moving the mirror, turn and set the control switch 1 to the center (neutral) position.



■ To open or close the mirrors, push the switch 2.



HEADLIGHT CONTROL SWITCH

HEADLIGHT CONTROL

■ Turn the headlight control switch to the 글 ◘ ☐ position 1 to turn on the front parking, tail, license plate and instrument panel lights.

Turn the switch to the □ position 2 to turn on the headlights.



AUTOLIGHT SYSTEM

- The autolight system will automatically turn the headlights on when it is dark and off when it is light. The system will keep the headlights on for a period of time after you turn the ignition off and all doors are closed.
- To activate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **AUTO** position then turn the ignition switch to ON. To deactivate the autolight system, turn the headlight control switch to the **OFF**, ∃D⊲∃ position 1 or ≨D position 2.

HIGH BEAM SELECT

- Push the headlight control switch forward 4 to select the high beam function. The blue indicator light ≣○ will illuminate in the instrument panel. Pull the headlight switch back to the original position to select the low beam. The blue indicator light will extinguish.
- Pull and release the headlight control switch to flash the headlight high beams on and off.



FOG LIGHT SWITCH (if so equipped)

- The headlights must be on and the low beams

 selected for the fog lights to operate.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the ‡D position 6 to turn the fog lights on.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the **OFF** position to turn the fog lights off.

LANE CHANGE SIGNAL

- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch to signal a lane change. Hold the lever until the lane change is completed.
- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch and release the lever. The turn signal will automatically flash 3 times.
- Choose the appropriate method to signal a lane change based on the road and traffic conditions.

WINDSHIELD WIPER AND WASHER SWITCH

- Move the lever to one of the following positions to operate the windshield wipers:
 - Mist (MIST) One sweep operation of the front wipers.
 - Intermittent (INT) Front wipers operate intermittently. The intermittent operation speed can be adjusted by twisting the time control ring
 to increase or decrease wiper speed.
 - 4 Low **(LO)** Front wipers operate at a continuous low-speed.
 - 5 High **(HI)** Front wipers operate at a continuous high-speed.
 - Front washer Pull the lever toward you to activate the front washer.

 The front wipers will operate several times.

REAR WINDSHIELD WIPER AND WASHER

- Intermittent (INT) Rear wiper operates intermittently.
- 8 Low (ON) Rear wiper operates at a continuous low-speed.
- 9 Rear washer (Push the lever forward to activate the rear washer. The rear wiper will operate several times.

AUTOMATIC CLIMATE CONTROLS

1 AUTO BUTTON/DRIVER'S SIDE TEMPERATURE CONTROL DIAL

- The automatic mode may be used year-round. Press the AUTO button to turn the system on, and the system will automatically control the inside temperature (automatic cooling and/or dehumidified heating), air flow distribution and fan speed.
- Turn the driver's side temperature control dial left for cooler air or right for warmer air.

2 DUAL BUTTON/PASSENGER'S SIDE TEMPERATURE CONTROL DIAL

- Press the **DUAL** button to turn the passenger's side temperature controls on or off. This will allow the passenger's side temperature to be adjusted independently from the driver's side.
- Turn the passenger's side temperature control dial left for cooler air or right for warmer air.

3 FAN SPEED CONTROL BUTTONS

■ Press the fan speed control buttons to manually increase the fan speed \$+ or decrease fan speed \$-.

4 DEFROSTING/DEFOGGING FRONT AND SIDE WINDOWS

- Press the front window defroster button to turn the system on. The A/C automatically turns on when the defroster mode is selected. This feature removes humidity from the air.
- Use the temperature control dial 1 to set the desired temperature.
- To set the front window defroster on high, press the fan speed control button \$+ to increase the fan speed to the maximum setting.

5 MODE BUTTON

■ Press the **MODE** button **5** to cycle through the following air flow outlets:

Air flows from the center and side vents.

Air flows from the center, side and foot vents.

Air flows mainly from the foot vents.

Air flows from the front defroster and foot vents.

6 REAR WINDOW AND OUTSIDE MIRROR DEFROSTER SWITCH

- Push the rear window defroster switch ## to turn the system on or off.
- The rear window defroster automatically turns off after approximately 15 minutes.

7 AIR RECIRCULATION BUTTON

- Press the air recirculation button (so to recirculate air inside the vehicle. The indicator light on the button will illuminate. This mode helps to adjust the inside vehicle temperature more effectively.
- Press the air recirculation button (again to turn air recirculation off. This allows outside air to be drawn into the passenger compartment to prevent fogging in front defroster, floor or front defroster/floor mode.
- The air recirculation mode cannot be activated when the climate control system is in the front defroster mode ∰ or the front defroster and foot vent ∰ mode.

8 A/C BUTTON

■ Press the A/C button to manually turn the A/C on or off.

9 OFF BUTTON

■ Press the **OFF** button to turn the climate control system off.

AM/FM/SiriusXM®* SATELLITE RADIO WITH CD/DVD PLAYER (if so equipped)

1 ON-OFF BUTTON/VOL (volume) CONTROL KNOB

- Press the **ON-OFF** button to turn the system on or off.
- Turn the **VOL** (volume) control knob right or left to increase or decrease the volume.

2 AUDIO BUTTON/TUNE/FLDR KNOB

- To manually tune the radio, turn the **TUNE/FLDR** knob left or right.
- Press the **AUDIO** button to go to the audio settings screen.

3 SEEK/CAT AND TRACK BUTTONS

- To scan quickly and stop at the previous or next broadcast station, press the |
 | SEEK/CAT button or the TRACK >>| button.
- For satellite radio, press the I◀◀ SEEK/CAT button or the TRACK ►► button to switch to the first channel of the previous or next category.
- To change tracks on a CD, press the I SEEK/CAT button or the TRACK >> button.
- To rewind or fast forward a track on a CD, press and hold the I◀◀ SEEK/CAT button or the TRACK ▶▶ button.

FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

4 STATION PRESET BUTTONS

- Six stations can be set for the AM band, 12 for the FM band and 18 for satellite radio.
- To store a station in a preset, you must first select a radio band by pressing the AM/FM button 5 or XM button 6 then tune to the desired AM, FM or satellite radio station.
- Next press and hold the desired station preset button (1-6) until the preset number is updated on the display and the sound is briefly muted. The channel indicator will then come on, and the sound will resume. Programing is now complete.
- To retrieve a previously set station, select the radio band where the preset was stored then press the corresponding station select button (1-6).

USB (Universal Serial Bus) CONNECTION PORT/ AUX JACK AND iPOD® INTERFACE

- The USB port/Aux jack 1 is located in the center console under the armrest.
- When a compatible USB memory device, iPod® or auxiliary device is plugged into the USB port/Aux jack, compatible audio files stored on the device can be played through the vehicle's audio system.

CRUISE CONTROL

- The cruise control system enables you to set a constant cruising speed once the vehicle has reached 25 mph (40 km/h).
- The system will automatically maintain the set speed until you tap the brake pedal, accelerate, cancel or turn the system off.
- To activate the cruise control, push the ON/OFF switch 1. The CRUISE indicator light in the vehicle information display will illuminate.



- To set a cruising speed, accelerate the vehicle to the desired speed, push the COAST/SET switch and release. The SET indicator light in the vehicle information display will illuminate. Take your foot off the accelerator pedal. Your vehicle will maintain the set speed.
- To reset at a faster cruising speed, push and hold the ACCEL/RES switch 3.
 When the vehicle attains the desired speed, release the switch.

- To reset at a slower cruising speed, push and hold the **COAST/SET** switch 2. Release the switch when the vehicle slows to the desired speed.
- To cancel the preset speed, tap the brake pedal or push the **CANCEL** switch 4.
- To turn off cruise control, push the **ON/OFF** switch **1**. Both the **CRUISE** indicator light and **SET** indicator light in the vehicle information display will extinguish.

POWER OUTLETS

- The power outlets are used for powering electrical accessories such as cellular telephones. They are rated at 12 volt, 120W (10A) maximum.
- Power outlets are located on the instrument panel 1, on the rear of the center console 2 and in the cargo area 3.
- To use a power outlet, open the cap.
- The power outlets are powered only when the ignition switch is in the ACC or ON position.

VEHICLE INFORMATION DISPLAY

- The vehicle information display 1 is located to the left of the speedometer.
- Press the vehicle information display INFO
 button 2 located on the instrument panel to toggle through the following modes:
 - MPG Displays the instant fuel economy since the last reset.
 - RANGE Displays the estimated distance the vehicle can be driven before refueling.
 - WARNING Displays when a warning is present.
- To highlight the desired menu option within the selected mode, turn the INFO button 2.
- To enter the highlighted menu, press the **INFO** button **2**.
- To reset **TRIP A** or **TRIP B**, go to the desired mode on the trip computer and press and hold the change button 3 for more than 1 second.

CONNECTING PROCEDURE FOR A BLUETOOTH® DEVICE

Use the procedure below to connect your Bluetooth® audio device to the vehicle:

- 2. Touch the "Connect Bluetooth" key.
- A pop-up box will appear on the screen, prompting you to confirm that the connection is for the hands-free phone system. Touch the "No" key.
- This will bring up the PIN pad on the screen.
 Enter a unique 4-digit PIN into the pad and touch the "OK" key.
 - When prompted for a PIN on the device, enter the unique 4-digit PIN that was entered on the screen.



PAIRING PROCEDURE

- The vehicle must be stationary when pairing the cellular phone.
- 1. Press the & button on the steering wheel. The system announces the available commands.
- 2. Say: "Connect Phone". The system acknowledges the command and announces the next set of available commands.
- 3. Say: "Add Phone". The system acknowledges the command and announces the next set of available commands.

- When prompted for a PIN, enter "1234" from the handset. (The PIN is assigned by NISSAN and cannot be changed.)
- For cellular phones that support SSP (Simple Secure Pairing), confirm the PIN on the vehicle display matches the PIN displayed on the cellular phone.
- 5. When the system asks you to provide a name for the cellular phone, say the name. You can give the cellular phone a name of your choice.

PHONEBOOK SETUP

- The phonebook stores up to 1,000 entries for each cellular phone paired with the system.
- Depending on your cellular phone, the system may automatically download your cellular phone's entire phonebook to the vehicle's Bluetooth® system.
- If the phonebook does not download automatically, entries can be individually downloaded.
- To manually download entries:
 - Push the
 \(\bigce \infty \) button on the steering wheel.
 - 2. After the tone, say "Phonebook".
 - 3. After the next tone, say "Transfer Entry". The system acknowledges the command and asks you to initiate the transfer from the cellular phone handset. The new contact phone number will be transferred from the cellular phone to the vehicle.
 - The transfer procedure varies according to each cellular phone. See your cellular phone's Owner's Manual for details. You can also visit www.NissanUSA.com/bluetooth for instructions on transferring phone numbers from NISSAN-recommended cellular phones.
 - 4. The system repeats the number and prompts you for the next command. When you have finished entering numbers or transferring an entry, choose "Store".
 - 5. The system confirms the name, location and number.

- In some cases, names stored using all UPPERCASE letters may not be recognized by the Voice Recognition system.

MAKING A CALL BY PHONE NUMBER

- 1. Press the & button.
- After waiting for the tone, say "Call". The system acknowledges the command and announces the next set of available commands.
- Say: "Number". The system acknowledges the command and announces the next set of available commands.
- 4. Say the number you wish to call starting with the area code in single digit format.
- When you have finished speaking the phone number, the system repeats it back and announces the available commands.
- 6. Say: "Dial". The system acknowledges the command and makes the call.

RECEIVING/ENDING A CALL

When you receive a cellular phone call, a ring tone sounds through the audio system.

- To accept the call, press the 🎉 🌈 button on the steering wheel.
- To reject the call, press the button on the steering wheel.
- To hang-up the cellular phone at the end of a call or to disconnect during call placement, press the ♠ button on the steering wheel.

PHONEBOOK SETUP

- Depending on your cellular phone, the system may automatically download your cellular phone's entire phonebook to the vehicle's Bluetooth® system.
- If the phonebook does not download automatically, the vehicle's phonebook may be set for up to 40 entries.
- To manually download entries:
 - Press the **PHONE** button and select the "Vehicle Phonebook" key.
 - Select the "Add New" key at the top of the display. There are different methods to input a phone number. Select one of the following options:
 - "Copy from Call History" to save a number from the Outgoing, Incoming or Missed Calls lists.
 - "Copy from the Handset" to save a number that has been downloaded from your handset to the vehicle.
 - "Enter Number by Keypad" to input the number and name manually.

MAKING A CALL

To make a call, follow this procedure:

- Press the **PHONE** button on the control panel or the ½ button on the steering wheel. The "Phone" menu will appear on the control panel display.
- Select the "Vehicle Phonebook", "Call History", "Handset Phonebook" or "Dial Number" key.
- 3. Select the desired entry from the list.
- Dialing begins when the entry is selected or when the "OK" key is selected.

RECEIVING/ENDING A CALL

- To accept the call, press the **PHONE** button on the control panel or the "button on the steering wheel or touch the "Answer" key.
- To reject a call, touch the "Reject Call" key on the display or press and hold the f button on the steering wheel.
- To hang-up, press the **f** button on the steering wheel or touch the "Hang up" key.

NAVIGATION SYSTEM (if so equipped)

- Your Navigation System can calculate a route from your current location to a preferred destination. The real-time map display and turn-by-turn voice guidance will lead you along the route.
- The Navigation System will continually update your vehicle's position. If you have deviated from the original route, it will recalculate the route from your current location.
- To help promote safe driving, some functions cannot be operated or have limited operation when the vehicle speed is above 5 mph (8 km/h). The on-screen text and keys for these restricted functions will be grayed-out or muted and cannot be selected while driving. These functions will become available again when the vehicle speed is reduced to 5 mph (8 km/h). Voice commands may be available for some of the restricted functions. For more information, refer to the "Monitor, climate, audio, phone and voice recognition systems (section 4)" of your Owner's Manual.
- 1 Touch-screen display
- 2 Destination (DEST) Press to enter a destination.
- ROUTE Press to access guidance control functions (guidance cancellation, route priority, waypoint setting on the route, etc.).
- 4 ★/J OFF Press to switch between the day screen (bright) and the night screen (dark). Press and hold the button to turn the display off. Press again to turn the display on.
- 5 MAP Press to display the map. While following a programed route, press multiple times to change the type of route information.


- 6 Multi-Function Controller
 - a. ENTER button Press to select the highlighted item on the screen. If this button is pressed while a map is displayed, the map menu screen is displayed.
 - Main directional buttons Press to move across the map, highlight an item on the screen or adjust a setting.
 - c. Additional directional buttons Press to move across the map or highlight an item on the character input screen.
 - d. Center dial Turn the dial to highlight an item on the screen, adjust a setting or adjust the map scale.
- 7 Information (INFO) Press to display the vehicle, traffic (if so equipped), weather (if so equipped) or voice recognition information.
- 8 DISPLAY Press to access the display settings.
- STATUS Press multiple times to display audio information with either the air conditioner status, fuel economy or navigation directions.
- **SETTING** Press to access the system settings.
- BACK Press to return to the previous screen. In a settings screen, this button can also be used to apply the setting. In a character input screen, this button can also delete the characters that have been entered.
- **VOICE** Press to hear the current voice guidance for a programed route.

REAR SEAT ENTERTAINMENT (RSE) SYSTEM (if so equipped)

- With this Dual Head Restraint DVD System, you can play DVD videos, video CDs or CDs that contain music or sound content. Images will display on the corresponding monitor, and sound will play from the vehicle's audio system (or wireless headphones provided in the kit) or your own wired headphones after connecting them to the headphone jacks of the corresponding DVD player.
- 1. Turn the vehicle ignition to ACC or ON.
- 2. Press the b (power) button 1 on each monitor control panel to power on.
- Insert a DVD (label facing to the rear of the vehicle) into either monitor.
- 4. Press the play button **2** to begin playing the DVD if it does not begin automatically.





5. To eject a DVD:

- Press the EJECT button 3 on the corresponding monitor control panel, or
- Press the corresponding MONITOR CONTROL button (DVD-A or DVD-B) on the remote control and then press the EJECT button

- 6. To turn the DVD system off:
 - Press the (b) (power) button 1 on the corresponding monitor control panel, or
 - Press the corresponding MONITOR CONTROL button (DVD–A or DVD–B) on the remote control and then press the ψ (power) button.
- You can also connect auxiliary devices, such as video games, camcorders, portable video players or USB devices to the auxiliary jacks located on the corresponding monitor control panel. (Your device will be controlled through its own control panel.)
- The system provides a priority for each of the following device inputs:
 - RCA ports, USB port, Disc player
 - A device connected through the RCA connections will override play of the disc player and USB port.



- Use the remote control provided with the system or the buttons on the corresponding monitor control panel to operate the rear display screens.
- Press the AUX button on the factory radio to listen to the audio on the vehicle's speakers.
- Use the headphones 4, also provided with the system, to listen to audio wirelessly and independently. You may also connect your own wired headphones to the headphone jacks located under the port covers of the corresponding monitor control panel.
- To use the headphones, set the select switch to "A" or "B" for use with the "A" monitor or "B" monitor respectively.



- For the best audio sound quality, please ensure you are facing the monitor directly in front of you.
- The wireless headphones will only operate in line of sight.
- Press the source button 5 on the corresponding monitor control panel or remote control to allow viewing Monitor A video on Monitor B and vice versa. Press the source button 5 to cycle through available video sources.

HOMELINK® UNIVERSAL TRANSCEIVER (if so equipped)

- The HomeLink® Universal Transceiver can learn and consolidate the functions of up to three different hand-held transmitters, operating items such as garage doors, property gates, outdoor and indoor lights or alarm systems.
- To program the HomeLink® Universal Transceiver:
 - Position the handheld transceiver 1-3 in (26-76 mm) away from the HomeLink surface, keeping the HomeLink indicator light in view.
 - Press and hold the desired HomeLink button and the handheld transmitter button simultaneously until the HomeLink indicator light flashes slowly and then rapidly.
 - Both buttons may be released when the indicator light flashes rapidly.
- To verify the programing is complete, press and hold the HomeLink button and observe the indicator light:
 - A solid, continuous light indicates the programing is complete and the HomeLink button will activate your device.
 - A blinking light that turns to a solid, continuous light after 2 seconds indicates additional steps are required to complete the programing.
- An additional person may make the remaining steps easier. To complete the programing process:
 - At the receiver of the device that you are programing to the HomeLink button, press and release the learn or smart button (the name may vary by manufacturer, but it is usually located near where the hanging antenna wire is attached to the unit). You have approximately 30 seconds to initiate the following step.
 - Press and hold the programed HomeLink button for 2 seconds and release.
- You may have to repeat the previous two steps up to 3 times to complete the programing process. HomeLink should now activate your device.
