

### **REARVIEW MONITOR (if so equipped)**

- When the shift lever is moved to the
   R (REVERSE) position, the front display
   shows the view to the rear of the vehicle.
- The colored lines on the display screen indicate approximate distances to objects.
  - Red 1.5 ft (0.5 m); Yellow 3 ft (1 m);
     Green 7 ft (2 m) and 10 ft (3 m).

# USB (Universal Serial Bus) CONNECTION PORT/AUX JACK AND iPOD® INTERFACE (if so equipped)

- The USB port/AUX jack 1 is located on the instrument panel below the climate controls.
- When a compatible USB memory device, iPod® or auxiliary device is plugged into the USB port/AUX jack 1, compatible audio files stored on the device can be played through the vehicle's audio system.
- The port is illuminated when the headlights are turned on.

### TRIP COMPUTER

- With the ignition switch in the ON position, modes of the trip computer
   can be selected by pressing the menu button
   on the steering wheel.
- When the menu button 2 on the steering wheel is pressed, the following modes will appear on the trip computer:
  - mpg Displays the current fuel consumption.
  - AVG mph Displays the average fuel consumption since the last reset.
  - miles – Displays the estimated distance to empty (dte) that can be driven before refueling.
  - AVG MPH Displays the average speed.
  - • → ④ Displays the total travel time since the last reset.
    - Pressing the menu button 2 on the steering wheel for more than 3 seconds will reset the average fuel consumption, average speed and travel time.
  - Outside Air Temperature (if so equipped) Displays the outside air temperature in °F or °C.
- To select trip A or trip B, press the brightness control knob
   Press the brightness control knob
   for approximately 1 second to reset the currently displayed trip odometer to zero.

# **NEW SYSTEM FEATURES**

### DIVIDE-N-HIDE® ADJUSTABLE FLOOR (if so equipped)

- Do not place more than 110 lbs (50 kg) on the adjustable floor.
- There are two positions to store the adjustable floor. The upper position
   allows for additional storage below the adjustable floor
- The adjustable floor has two retaining tabs
  on each side to secure the floor in place.
  When the retaining tabs
  are in the lock
  position (outboard), the adjustable floor may
  be moved along the tracks from the lower
  position
  to the upper position
  and vice versa. When the tabs are in the unlock
  position (inboard), the adjustable floor may
  be removed completely.

To slide the adjustable floor from the lower position **3** to the upper position **1** using the quide tracks:

- 1. Fold the adjustable floor 2 in half.
- 2. Lift the floor and pull up along the guide tracks.
- 3. Push the floor back then unfold the floor.

# **ESSENTIAL INFORMATION**

# TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS) WITH EASY-FILL TIRE ALERT (if so equipped)

- When one or more tires are low in pressure and air is needed, the low tire pressure warning light
   will illuminate in the trip computer
   and the low pressure light
   for the corresponding tire will blink.
  - The tire pressures should be checked when the tires are cold. The tires are considered cold after the vehicle has been parked for 3 hours or more or driven less than 1 mi (1.6 km) at moderate speeds.



- After tire pressures are adjusted, drive the vehicle at speeds above 16 mph (25 km/h). The low tire pressure warning light 2 and the low pressure light 3 for the corresponding tire will extinguish.
- When adding air to an under-inflated tire, the TPMS with Easy-Fill Tire Alert (if so equipped) provides visual and audible signals to help you inflate the tire to the recommended COLD tire pressure.
- To use the Easy-Fill Tire Alert (if so equipped):
  - 1. Move the shift lever to the P (PARK) position and apply the parking brake.
  - 2. Place the ignition switch in the ON position. Do not start the engine.
  - Add air to the under-inflated tire, and within a few seconds, the hazard warning lights will start flashing.
  - 4. When the designated tire pressure is reached, the horn will beep once and the hazard warning flashers will stop flashing.
  - 5. Repeat this procedure for any additional under-inflated tires.
- When the low tire pressure warning light 2 flashes for 1 minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. Have the system checked. It is recommended you visit a Nissan dealer for this service.
- Tire pressure rises and falls depending on the heat caused by the vehicle's operation and the outside temperature. Low outside temperature can lower the temperature of the air inside the tire, which can cause a lower tire inflation pressure. This may cause the low tire pressure warning light 2 to illuminate. If the warning light illuminates, check the tire pressure in your tires.
  - Check the tire pressure (including the spare tire) often and always prior to long distance trips.
- The Tire and Loading Information label contains valuable information. Please refer to the "Technical and consumer information (section 10)" of your Owner's Manual for the location of the Tire and Loading Information label.

# **ESSENTIAL INFORMATION**

### LOOSE FUEL CAP

- A LOOSE FUEL CAP warning message will display in the trip computer
   when the fuel-filler cap is not tightened correctly.
- To tighten, turn the cap clockwise until a single click is heard.
- The warning message will extinguish when the vehicle detects the fuel-filler cap is properly tightened and the reset button is pressed for more than 1 second.



■ If the cap is not fully tightened, the Malfunction Indicator Light [ ] may also illuminate.

### **FUEL-FILLER DOOR**

- The fuel-filler door is located on the driver's side of the vehicle.

### **CLOCK SET/ADJUSTMENT**

FM/AM RADIO WITH COMPACT DISC (CD) PLAYER (if so equipped)

- Press the MENU button 1 repeatedly until "Adjust Clock: NO" appears on the display.
- Turn the TUNE/FOLDER knob 2 to change to "Adjust Clock: YES".
- 3. Press the **MENU** button 1.
- When "Change Hour" appears, turn the TUNE/FOLDER knob 2 to adjust the hours.
- 5. Press the **MENU** button 1.
- When "Change Minute" appears, turn the TUNE/FOLDER knob 2 to adjust the minutes.
- 7. Press the **MENU** button 1 to finish.

### FM/AM/SAT RADIO WITH COMPACT DISC (CD) PLAYER (if so equipped)

- Press the ENTER/SETTING/CLOCK button 3 to show the "Settings" screen on the display.
- Turn the TUNE/SCROLL knob 4 to highlight "Clock Adjust".
- Press the ENTER/SETTING/CLOCK button 3
   to highlight the hours or minutes and use the
   TUNE/SCROLL knob 4 to adjust the value.
- 4. Press the ENTER/SETTING/CLOCK button to set the value.





# FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

### NISSAN INTELLIGENT KEY® SYSTEM (if so equipped)

The Nissan Intelligent Key® system allows you to lock or unlock your vehicle and activate the panic alarm. It is important to make sure the Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).

- The operating range of the Intelligent Key is within 31.5 in (80 cm) from each request switch.
- To lock the vehicle, press the i button 1 on the key fob or push either door handle request switch 2 once.
- To unlock the vehicle, perform one of the following procedures:
  - Push either door handle request switch 2 once; the corresponding door will unlock.
     Push the door handle request switch 2 again within 60 seconds; all other doors will unlock, or





### INTELLIGENT KEY BATTERY DISCHARGE

- If the battery of the Intelligent Key is discharged or environmental conditions interfere with the Intelligent Key operation, start the engine according to the following procedure:
  - Move the shift lever to the P (PARK) or N (NEUTRAL) position.
  - 2. Firmly apply the foot brake.
  - Touch the ignition switch with the Intelligent Key, and a chime will sound.
  - Within 10 seconds after the chime sounds, push the ignition switch while depressing the brake pedal and the engine will start.

# REAR HATCH RELEASE (Nissan Intelligent Key® models only - if so equipped)

- To open the rear hatch, unlock it with one of the following operations:
  - Press the putton on the key fob twice.
  - Push the rear hatch request switch 2 while carrying the Nissan Intelligent Key® with you.
- Then pull the handle 3 located below the rear hatch request switch 2.
- Pull up on the rear hatch to open.

### SEAT ADJUSTMENTS


- To slide the front seat forward or backward, pull up on the lever

- To recline the seatback, pull up on the lever and lean back. To bring the seatback forward, pull the lever up and lean your body forward. Release the lever to lock the seatback in position.

SEAT LIFTER (if so equipped for driver's seat)

 To adjust the seat height, pull up or push down on the adjusting lever
 repeatedly.

### STARTING/STOPPING THE ENGINE

### STARTING THE ENGINE

It is important to make sure the Intelligent Key is with you (that is, in your pocket or purse).

CONTINUOUSLY VARIABLE TRANSMISSION (Nissan Intelligent Key® models only - if so equipped)

- Depress the brake pedal.
  - If the brake pedal is not depressed, pushing the ignition switch once enters to ACC.
  - If the ignition switch is pushed a second time, the vehicle will enter to ON.
- Move the shift lever to the **P (PARK)** position.
- Push the ignition switch to start or stop the engine.

### MANUAL TRANSMISSION/CONTINUOUSLY VARIABLE TRANSMISSION (if so equipped)

- Depress the brake pedal.
- Move the shift lever to the N (NEUTRAL) position.
- Depress the clutch pedal to the floor (manual transmission only).
- Turn the ignition switch to the START position.

### TURNING THE ENGINE OFF

- For a Continuously Variable Transmission (Nissan Intelligent Key® models only if so equipped), apply the brake pedal, move the shift lever to the **P (PARK)** position, apply the parking brake and push the ignition switch button or turn the ignition switch to the **LOCK** position to turn the engine off.
- For a manual transmission, apply the brake pedal, place the vehicle in
   N (NEUTRAL), apply the parking brake and turn the ignition switch to the
   LOCK position.

### **HEADLIGHT CONTROL SWITCH**

### HEADLIGHT CONTROL

■ Turn the headlight control switch to the DOT position 1 to turn on the front parking, tail, license plate and instrument panel lights.

Turn the switch to the Dosition 2 to turn on the headlights.



### HIGH BEAM SELECT

■ With the headlights ON, push the headlight control switch forward 3 to select the high beam function. The blue indicator light ≣O will illuminate in the instrument panel. Pull the headlight switch back to the original position to select the low beam. The blue indicator light will extinguish.



Pull and release the headlight control switch 4 to flash the headlight high beams on and off.

### FOG LIGHT SWITCH (if so equipped)

- The headlights must be on and the low beams 🗐 selected for the fog lights to operate.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the ‡D position 5 to turn the fog lights on.
- Turn the switch (inside collar) to the **OFF** position to turn the fog lights off.



### LANE CHANGE SIGNAL

- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch to signal a lane change. Hold the lever until the lane change is completed.
- Move the lever up or down until the turn signal begins to flash but the lever does not latch and release the lever. The turn signal will automatically flash three times.



Choose the appropriate method to signal a lane change based on road and traffic conditions.

# FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

### **HEATER AND AIR CONDITIONER (manual)**

### 1 FAN SPEED CONTROL DIAL

Turn the dial to the left to decrease fan speed or to the right to increase fan speed.

### 2 AIR FLOW CONTROL DIAL

- Turn the dial to select one of the following air flow outlets:
  - Air flows from the center and side vents.
  - Air flows from the center, side and foot vents.
  - Air flows mainly from the foot vents.




- Air flows from the front defroster and foot vents.
- Air flows mainly from the front defroster and side vents.

### **3** TEMPERATURE CONTROL DIAL

■ Turn the temperature control dial left for cooler air or right for warmer air.

### 4 DEFROSTING/DEFOGGING FRONT AND SIDE WINDOWS

- First, move the air intake lever 5 to the left position to draw fresh air into the vehicle.
- Next turn the air flow control dial 2 to the front defroster mode **W**.
- Align the left and right side vents 6 to direct the air flow toward the front side windows.
- Then turn the fan control dial 1 to the desired position and the temperature control dial 3 to the desired position.



When the or position is selected,
 press the A/C button for better
 performance. This will dehumidify the air and help defog the windows.

# 7 REAR WINDOW AND OUTSIDE MIRROR (if so equipped) DEFROSTER SWITCH

- Push the rear window and outside mirror (if so equipped) defroster switch to turn the system on or off.
- This function automatically turns off after approximately 15 minutes.


### 8 A/C BUTTON

Press the A/C button to turn the air conditioner on. This system helps cool and dehumidify the air inside the cabin and defog the windows.

### WIPER AND WASHER SWITCH


- Move the lever to one of the following positions to operate the windshield wipers:
  - 1 Mist (MIST) One sweep operation of the wipers.
  - Intermittent (INT) Wipers operate intermittently. The intermittent operation speed can be adjusted by rotating the time control ring 3 to increase or decrease wiper speed (if so equipped).





- 4 Low (LO) Wipers operate at a continuous low-speed.
- 5 High (HI) Wipers operate at a continuous high-speed.
- 6 Washer | Pull the lever toward you to activate the washer. The wipers will operate several times.

### REAR WIPER AND WASHER

- Intermittent (INT) Rear wiper operates intermittently.
- 8 Low (ON) Rear wiper operates at a continuous low-speed.
- Push the lever forward to activate the rear washer. The rear wiper will operate several times.

### **OUTSIDE MIRROR CONTROL SWITCH**

- Move the small switch 1 right or left to select the right or left mirror.
- Adjust each mirror to the desired position using the switch 2.
- Move the switch 1 to the center (neutral) position to prevent accidentally moving the mirror.

# FIRST DRIVE FEATURES

### CRUISE CONTROL (if so equipped)

- The cruise control system enables you to set a constant cruising speed once the vehicle has reached 25 mph (40 km/h).
- The system will automatically maintain the set speed until you tap the brake pedal, accelerate, cancel or turn the system off.
- To activate the cruise control, push the
   ON/OFF switch
   I on the steering wheel.
   The CRUISE indicator light in the instrument panel will illuminate.



- To set a cruising speed, accelerate the vehicle to the desired speed, push the COAST/SET switch
   on the steering wheel and release. Take your foot off the accelerator pedal. Your vehicle will maintain the set speed.
- To reset at a faster cruising speed, push and hold the ACCEL/RES switch
   on the steering wheel. When the vehicle attains the desired speed, release the switch.
- To reset at a slower cruising speed, push and hold the COAST/SET switch
   on the steering wheel. Release the switch when the vehicle slows to the desired speed.
- To cancel the preset speed, push the CANCEL switch 4 on the steering wheel.
- To turn off cruise control, push the ON/OFF switch 1 on the steering wheel.
  The CRUISE indicator light in the instrument panel will extinguish.

# FM/AM/SiriusXM® SATELLITE RADIO WITH CD PLAYER (if so equipped)

- 1 (power) BUTTON and VOL (volume) CONTROL KNOB
  - Press the **()** (power) button to turn the system on or off.
  - Turn the VOL (volume) control knob to the right or left to increase or decrease the volume.

### 2 ENTER/SETTING/CLOCK BUTTON and TUNE/SCROLL KNOB

- Press the ENTER/SETTING/CLOCK button to show the settings screen and make a selection.
- To manually tune the radio, turn the TUNE/SCROLL knob left or right.

### 3 SEEK/CAT BUTTONS

- To tune and stop at the previous or next broadcast station, press the seek buttons | ◀ ◀ or ▶ ▶ |.
- For satellite radio to switch to the first channel of the previous or next category, press the seek buttons |◀◀ or ▶▶|.
- To change tracks on a CD, press the seek buttons I or ▶▶.
- To rewind or fast forward a track on a CD, press and hold the seek buttons | ◀ or ▶ ▶ |.

### 4 STATION SELECT BUTTONS

- Twelve stations can be set for the FM band, six for the AM band and 18 for satellite radio.
- To store a station in a preset, you must first select a radio band by pressing the FM-AM button
   or the XM button
   then tune to the desired FM, AM or satellite radio station.
- Now touch and hold the desired station memory key (1-6) 4 until the preset number is updated on the display and a beep is heard. Programing is now complete.
- To retrieve a previously set station, select the radio band where the preset was stored then touch the corresponding station memory key (1-6)

# SYSTEM GUIDE

### **BLUETOOTH® HANDS-FREE PHONE SYSTEM\***

 A cellular telephone should not be used while driving so full attention may be given to vehicle operation.

### SYSTEM OPERATING TIPS

- Press the ₺ or ₺ button on the steering wheel to interrupt the voice prompts at any time and speak a command after the tone.
- To use the system faster, you may speak the second level commands with the main menu command on the main menu. For example, press the ﴿ or ﴿ f button on the steering wheel, and after the tone, say "Call Redial".
- The "Help" command can be used to hear a list of available commands at any time.
- Reduce background noise as much as possible by closing windows and pointing HVAC vents away from the ceiling.
- Speak naturally without long pauses and without raising your voice.

TYPE A (if so equipped)



- To cancel a Voice Recognition session, simply wait 5 seconds, say "Cancel" or "Quit", or press and hold the or button on the steering wheel for 5 seconds.
- To increase or decrease the volume of the voice prompts, push the volume control switches + or on the steering wheel or turn the volume control knob on the audio system while the audio system is responding.
- Voice commands can be used to operate various Bluetooth® system features using the Nissan Voice Recognition system. See your Owner's Manual for detailed information.
- If the Voice Recognition system does not recognize your voice commands, train the system using the Voice Adaptation Mode. See your Owner's Manual for detailed information.

### CONNECTING PROCEDURE

The vehicle must be stationary when connecting the cellular phone.

- 1. Press the √2 or √2 button on the steering wheel. The system announces the available commands.
- Say: "Connect Phone". The system acknowledges the command and announces the next set of available commands.
- Say: "Add Phone". The system acknowledges the command and asks you to initiate connecting from the cellular phone handset.

- 4. Initiate connecting from the cellular phone:
  - The connecting procedure varies according to each cellular phone model. For detailed connecting instructions and compatible cellular phones, please visit www.NissanUSA.com/bluetooth.
  - When prompted for a PIN, enter "1234" from the handset. (The PIN is assigned by NISSAN and cannot be changed.)
- 5. Say a name for the cellular phone when the system asks you to provide one. You can give the cellular phone a name of your choice.

### PHONEBOOK SETUP

- The phonebook stores up to 1,000 entries for each cellular phone paired with the system.

- To manually download entries:

  - The system repeats the number and prompts you for the next command. When you have finished entering numbers or transferring an entry, say "Store".
  - 5. The system confirms the name, location and number.

### MAKING A CALL FROM THE PHONEBOOK

In some cases, names stored using all UPPERCASE letters may not be recognized by the Voice Recognition system.

- 1. Press the w or w f button on the steering wheel.
- 2. After waiting for the tone, say "Call".
- After the next tone, speak the name of a phonebook entry. For example, "Michael Smith".
- 4. Confirm the correct name is recognized by saying "Dial" after the tone.





# TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS) WITH EASY-FILL TIRE ALERT (if so equipped)

- When one or more tires are low in pressure and air is needed, the low tire pressure warning light
   will illuminate in the odometer
   and the CHECK TIRE PRES (pressure) warning message
   is displayed.
  - The tire pressures should be checked when the tires are cold. The tires are considered cold after the vehicle has been parked for 3 hours or more or driven less than 1 mi (1.6 km) at moderate speeds.



- After tire pressures are adjusted, drive the vehicle at speeds above
   16 mph (25 km/h) to activate the TPMS and the low tire pressure
   warning light
   will extinguish.
- When adding air to an under-inflated tire, the TPMS with Easy-Fill Tire Alert (if so equipped) provides visual and audible signals to help you inflate the tire to the recommended COLD tire pressure.
- To use the Easy-Fill Tire Alert (if so equipped):
  - 1. Move the shift lever to the P (Park) position and apply the parking brake.
  - 2. Place the ignition switch in the ON position. Do not start the engine.
  - 3. Add air to the under-inflated tire, and within a few seconds, the hazard warning lights will start flashing.
  - When the designated tire pressure is reached, the horn will beep once and the hazard warning flashers will stop flashing.
  - 5. Repeat this procedure for any additional under-inflated tires.
- When the low tire pressure warning light 2 flashes for 1 minute and then remains on, the TPMS is not functioning properly. Have the system checked. It is recommended that you visit a Nissan dealer for this service.
- Tire pressure rises and falls depending on the heat caused by the vehicle's operation and the outside temperature. Low outside temperature can lower the temperature of the air inside the tire, which can cause a lower tire inflation pressure. This may cause the low tire pressure warning light 2 to illuminate. If the warning light illuminates, check the tire pressure in your tires.
  - Check the tire pressure (including the spare tire) often and always prior to long distance trips.

   accelerator pedal. Your vehicle will maintain the set speed.
- To reset at a faster cruising speed, push and hold the ACCEL/RES switch 3 on the steering wheel. When the vehicle attains the desired speed, release the switch.
- To reset at a slower cruising speed, push and hold the COAST/SET switch
   on the steering wheel. Release the switch when the vehicle slows to the desired speed.
- To cancel the preset speed, push the **CANCEL** switch 4 on the steering wheel.
- To turn off cruise control, push the **ON/OFF** switch 1 on the steering wheel. The **CRUISE** indicator light in the instrument panel will extinguish.

■ Press the I◀ button or the ▶▶ button to seek up or down to the next receivable station.

## 3 AUDIO BUTTON

- Press the **AUDIO** button to bring up the current source's control screen.
- Pressing this button will give access to the AM, FM, USB/iPod®, Bluetooth Audio or AUX audio source.
- Twelve memory stations can be set for the FM band and six for the AM band. These appear at the bottom of the screen when one of these sources is selected.
- To store a station in a preset, you must first select a radio band by touching the "AM" key 4 or "FM" key 5 then tune to the desired AM or FM radio station. Next, touch and hold the desired station preset key until you hear a beep. The channel indicator will then display, and the sound will resume. Programing is now complete.
- To retrieve a previously set station, select the radio band where the preset was stored then touch the corresponding station select key.

#### SYSTEM OPERATING TIPS

- Press the ₺ or ₺ ਿ button on the steering wheel to interrupt the voice prompts at any time and speak a command after the tone.
- Reduce background noise as much as possible by closing windows and pointing heater and air conditioner vents away from the ceiling.
- Speak naturally without long pauses and without raising your voice.
- If you experience difficulty with the Voice Recognition System recognizing a contact name, please try saying both the first and last name of the contact as this improves recognition accuracy.
- MICROPHONE
- To cancel a Voice Recognition session, simply wait 5 seconds, say "Cancel" or "Quit", or press and hold the v\( \) or v\( \) button on the steering wheel for 5 seconds
- To increase or decrease the volume of the voice prompts, push the volume control switches + or - on the steering wheel or turn the volume control knob on the control panel while the audio system is responding.



#### PHONEBOOK SETUP

- Touch the "Phone" key and then touch the "Phonebook" key.
- Depending on your cellular phone, the system may automatically download your cellular phone's entire phonebook to the vehicle's Bluetooth® system.
- The Quick Dial phonebook can also be set with up to twenty entries that can be used with your cellular phone.
- From the "Phone" display screen, touch the "Quick Dial" key.
- Touch the "Edit" key and then the "Add New" key at the top of the display. There are different methods to input a phone number. Select one of the following options:
  - "Copy from Call History" to save a number from the Outgoing, Incoming or Missed Calls lists.
  - "Copy from the Phonebook" to save a number that has been downloaded from your handset to the vehicle.

#### MAKING A CALL FROM THE PHONEBOOK

- In some cases, names stored using all UPPERCASE letters may not be recognized by the Voice Recognition system.
- 1. Press the we or we button on the steering wheel.
- 2. After waiting for the tone, say "Call".
- The system will ask for a phonebook name followed by location type if known.
- After the next tone, speak the name of a phonebook entry. For example, "Michael Smith".
- If it does not automatically dial, confirm the correct name and location is recognized by saying or selecting the item number.

## MAKING A CALL BY PHONE NUMBER

- 1. Press the ₩2 or ₩2 button on the steering wheel. A tone will sound.
- 2. Say: "Dial". The system will ask for a phone number.
- 3. Say the number you wish to call starting with the area code in single digit format.
- 4. The system repeats it back and announces the available commands.
- 5. Say: "Dial". The system acknowledges the command and makes the call.

#### RECEIVING/ENDING A CALL

- To accept the call:
  - Press the or button on the steering wheel, or
  - Touch the "Answer" key on the touchscreen display.
- To reject the call:
  - Touch the "Decline" key on the touchscreen display.
- To hold the call:
  - Touch the "Hold Call" key on the touchscreen display.
- To hang up:
  - Press the or button on the steering wheel, or
  - Touch the "Hang up" key on the touch-screen display.
